"What's Good for the Goose..." - Sunday, March 24, 1:00 p.m – 3:00 p.m.

Spring is on its way, and with spring comes the return of geese from their winter migration grounds. But before the geese arrive, we humans need to remember how we can best live in harmony with this iconic, but sometimes territorial, species. Join us to learn about geese families, why they nest in certain areas, and how you can make sure that your local geese are safe and healthy!

"Baby Boom" - Saturday, May 25, 1:00 p.m – 3:00 p.m.

The baby season has arrived for Alberta's wildlife, and that means the admission of dozens of animals per day to AIWC. Come join us for a special Talk and Tour focusing on wildlife babies, including how we care for the many different species at AIWC, why we need to raise so many babies each year, and what you can do to help these vulnerable creatures in your own backyard.

"Songbird Symphonies" - Sunday, June 16, 1:00 p.m – 3:00 p.m.

Springtime in Alberta is filled with an amazing array of sounds, many of which come from our local songbirds! During this month's Talk and Tour, we will be chatting about the many different species of songbirds that make Alberta their home, the special care they require while at AIWC, and how you can help stop the multitude of threats that songbirds must face in the wild.

"The Fast and the Furious: All about Falcons" - Sunday, July 20, 1:00 p.m – 3:00 p.m.

Come and join us for a special Talk and Tour all about the fastest animals on the planet! Learn how some falcons were pushed to the brink of extinction, how they recovered, their incredible hunting strategies, and how we care for falcons here at AIWC!

"Master Migrators" - Sunday, August 18, 1:00 p.m – 3:00 p.m.

Just a few short months after arriving in Alberta for the breeding season, many of our migratory species are already starting to prepare for their journey back south for the winter. Join us as we explore which species migrate, how they make this incredible journey, and just how far some animals will go for a warm winter destination!

"Batty for Bats" - Saturday, October 19, 1:00 p.m – 3:00 p.m.

Though bats have a reputation for being a bit scary, all of Alberta's 9 bat species are only after insects for their dinner! Join us for this special presentation all about Alberta's bat species, including which ones you are most likely to encounter, how they live in this wintery environment, and what you can do to ensure these wonderful pest controllers stick around for many years to come.
