## **Terms and Conditions August 2020**

By submitting a photograph, you are granting the Alberta Institute for Wildlife Conservation (AIWC) a non-exclusive license to use the photograph as AIWC so chooses. You also affirm that you have the proper ownership of the submitted photograph and have the authority to grant such a license. You also consent and agree:

- to the use of your photographs and materials submitted in any and all of AIWC's publications, including website entries, broadcast media, public displays, or social media, without payment or any other considerations;
- to the use of your name in association with the photograph and materials submitted;
- to the reproduction by AIWC in whole or in part of any photographs and materials submitted;
- to the unrestricted distribution within AIWC of such photographs and materials submitted for educational purposes or by, for and between AIWC's officers, directors, employees, agents or assignees;
- to receiving no financial or other consideration for the production or use of the photographs and materials submitted;
- to waive the right to approve any finished product or output, including written or electronic copies, of the photograph and materials submitted; and
- to hold harmless, release and forever discharge AIWC from all claims, demands and causes of action which you, your heirs, representatives, executors, administrators, or any person acting on your behalf or on behalf of your estate have or may have by reason of this permission.

## **Photo Requirements August 2020**

- Images should be colour (RGB) and landscape format. Please note that photos will be cropped to fit within the 11in(W) x 8.5in(H) calendar frame.
- Entries can only be accepted in digital format. Files should be JPEG format and no larger than 10MB.
- Images should be a minimum of 2000 pixels on the long edge and free of signatures, watermarks, or other text.
- Only photography of native Alberta wildlife species in the wild are to be submitted. Photos of domestic or captive animals (even in a rehabilitation setting) will not be considered.
- Entrants must be considerate of wildlife and not do anything that could injure or distress an animal or their habitat.
- Photos of nesting birds will not be allowed as we do not want to encourage disturbance to the young and parents.
- Live baiting for photography is not permitted.
